Why would I do it? Why would I send you and other people around the country a real \$1 Bill?

That's what some of our staff at the Law Enforcement Officers Relief Fund (LEORF) wanted to know. They told me I was taking a risk. "What if everyone keeps the money and you never hear back from them?"

Maybe you're wondering the same thing. My response is twofold:

1. I've only mailed this \$1 Bill to Americans like you who have always respected the service and sacrifice of our nation's law enforcement officers and their families. I don't believe there is any way you would keep this dollar when you know it will help our men and women in law enforcement;
2. Mailing a \$1 Bill isn't a risk. Putting yourself between a violent criminal and an innocent citizen. ... THAT is a real risk... a life-and-death risk that sheriffs, detectives, and beat cops take each day when they start their shift.

My name is Sam Cabal and I proudly serve as President of the Board of Directors for the Law Enforcement Officers Relief Fund (LEORF).

Our mission is very simple and even more-so important:

We provide immediate assistance to Law Enforcement Officer's surviving family member when they need it most.

The sad reality is that many of the officers who die in the line of duty are from smaller communities that don't have adequate resources, death benefits, or fully funded pensions to provide to the surviving family. In the meantime, the families can be left without any funds to cover immediate expenses.

We're here to be a safety-net for survivors. How are we able to do that? There's only one way - With your support, Gregory.
